The Executive Manager, Monitoring, Control & Surveillance (MCS) reports to the Deputy Managing Director, Fisheries Management Technical/Operations (FMTO).

Key Responsibilities:

- Monitoring and enforcement operational functions encompassing observer program, port sampling, food safety and audit, catch certification and documentation, exports and associated programs, projects and activities
- With strong strategic and tactical foresight, ensure a coordinated approach to collaboration with national disciplined forces, provincial governments, regional organizations and fisheries stakeholder groups in the effective implementation of enforcement programs.

Expected Competencies

- Minimum qualification of a first degree in either Fisheries Science, Fisheries Management or Law. Preference for short course training in fisheries law, compliance, investigation or prosecution. Post-graduate qualifications are highly desirable
- Minimum of 5 years' experience in a senior management in fisheries management or law; with at least 2 years work experience in a monitoring, surveillance or investigative environment
- Proven technical experience in fisheries monitoring, control and surveillance management and coordination with a sound understanding of fisheries surveillance strategies in a national and regional context
- Good working knowledge and understanding of seafood product certification systems and production standards with a sound knowledge of international certification standards
- Good understanding of seafood technology relating to quality management, spoilage, hygiene, certification, labeling, and export and import standards and systems. Clear understanding of monitoring and surveillance needs for fishery and marine resource planning and management and a good working knowledge of national fisheries issues, fisheries law and regulatory processes relating to prosecution procedures
- Well-developed understanding of the Fisheries Management Act 1998 and government objectives and policies; as well as a good understanding of national fisheries issues, fisheries law and regulatory processes
- Demonstrated experience in budgeting, financial management and reporting
- Excellent oral and written communication and report writing skills, with high level presentation skills (particularly the presentation of diagrammatic information using graphs and charts)
- Demonstrated leadership capabilities with excellent people management skills
- Advanced Computer literacy skills.
